7 Aug 2024 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *Amnesty International.* Global human rights group Amnesty International reports that since 2009, private businesses have been complicit in forced evictions of Maasai Indigenous communities from their ancestral lands in **Loliondo** (**Ngorongoro** district) by Tanzanian authorities;

7 Aug 2024 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *Nation.* The ceasefire negotiated in **Luanda** (Angola) between Rwanda and the DRC appears to have collapsed before it could take effect following an outbreak of violence between the warring parties;

6 Aug 2024 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *Africa News.* South African police said they rescued 90 Ethiopian migrants who were being held against their will at a property in **Johannesburg**;

6 Aug 2024 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *Business Daily.* The **Central Bank of Kenya (CBK)** cut its benchmark interest rate key rate to 12.75% from 13%, the first cut since early 2020, surprising financial markets;

5 Aug 2024 **Addis Ababa (Ethiopia)** *Bloomberg.* State minister in the finance ministry **Eyob Tekalign Tolina** says government is planning to spend an additional 550 billion birr (\$6.84 billion) to cushion citizens against the impact of economic reforms;

5 Aug 2024 **Djibouti (Djibouti)** *Reuters.* A **Liberian**-flagged container ship that was hit by **Houthi** militants off **Yemen** on 3 August in the first such attack in two weeks, has arrived safely in Djibouti;

5 Aug 2024 **Djibouti (Djibouti)** *The Africa Report.* Following the 25 July ruling by the **United States (US)** District Court for the District of Columbia requiring Djibouti to pay a \$200m fine to the **Dubai**-based port group, **DP Group**, the country's government has refused to pay the fine;

5 Aug 2024 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *CNBC Africa.* **The Stanbic Bank Kenya Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI)** falls to 43.1 from 47.2 in June, indicating a contraction in activity, a reflection of the impacts of the anti-government protests in June/July;

4 Aug 2024 **Djibouti (Djibouti)** *Daily News Egypt.* **Egyptian** authorities say they will import large quantities of live sheep and goats from Djibouti and **Somalia** for immediate slaughter, in a bid to curb meat prices following an influx of tourists and expatriates;

4 Aug 2024 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *VOA.* Local sources report that **M23** rebels captured **Ishasha** town on the border with **Uganda**;

2 Aug 2024 **Bujumbura (Burundi)** *Anadolu Agency.* President **Evariste Ndayishimiye** calls for regional coordination in sub-Saharan Africa to help restore peace in the conflict-torn DRC;

2 Aug 2024 **Bujumbura (Burundi)** *Anadolu Agency.* **Zambia** and Burundi on 1 August signed six bilateral agreements to boost cooperation in various fields, including agriculture and security;

2 Aug 2024 **Bujumbura (Burundi)** *New Times.* **Burundi** on 1 August became the sixth country to join **East African Community (EAC)**'s **One Network Area**, aimed at reducing communication costs;

1 Aug 2024 Addis Ababa (Ethiopia) *Reuters.* Oromia region local government and Addis Ababa City Trade Bureau shut down several businesses found hiking prices of basic commodities following the National Bank of Ethiopia's (central bank) decision to float the birr;

1 Aug 2024 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *The Citizen.* President **Samia Suluhu Hassan** launches the 541-km standard gauge railway which connects Dar es Salaam and **Dodoma**;

1 Aug 2024 **Kampala (Uganda)** *New Vision.* **Gabon**'s transitional president, General **Brice Oligui Nguema**, arrives in Gabon for a three-day visit;

1 Aug 2024 **Nairobi (Kenya)** *Africanews.* **Kenya National Bureau of Statistics** reports annual inflation dropped from 4.6% in June to 4.3% in July;

31 Jul 2024 **Dar es Salaam (Tanzania)** *Al Jazeera.* **United States (US)**-headquartered **Human Rights Watch (HRW)** says in a report that the Tanzanian government has been forcibly evicting indigenous **Maasai** from their ancestral lands;

31 Jul 2024 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *AFP.* **European Union (EU)** welcomes the ceasefire agreed on between **Rwanda** and **Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)** in eastern DRC, and asks all sides to respect the terms;

30 Jul 2024 Addis Ababa (Ethiopia) *Business Live.* World Bank approves a \$1.5 billion financing package for Ethiopia after the country secured a four-year \$3.4 billion programme with the International Monetary Fund (IMF);

29 Jul 2024 Addis Ababa (Ethiopia) *Business Live.* The birr's value falls 30% against the United States (US) dollar, trading at 74.73/\$, after National Bank of Ethiopia (central bank) floated the currency;

29 Jul 2024 **Kinshasa (DRC)** *Reuters.* Government accuses the **M23** rebels and **Rwandan** forces backing them of sending false navigation signals to disrupt air traffic over **North Kivu** province;

29 Jul 2024 **Kampala (Uganda)** *Reuters.* Kampala magistrate's court charges 36 opposition **Forum for Democratic Change (FDC)** members on terrorism-related offences after they were deported from **Kenya** where they travelled to attend a training course;
